# WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE MALVERN C.I. AT 110 REUNION PLEASE REGISTER NOW AND KEEP THIS COPY FOR REFERENCE

We know that you need some details about the upcoming Reunion so that you can make plans and pre-register by 30 April 2013, but preferably much sooner – like today! PLEASE PRE-REGISTER SO THAT WE DO NOT HAVE LONG LINES ON 11 MAY. You can order a sandwich lunch by 30 April too, but at the door we are taking registrations only. Your mail-in form for cheques is with the snail mailing of the *Musings*, and you may also register and pay electronically at <u>www.eventbrite.ca</u>. You may also sign up for a pre-ordered lunch (\$10) and for any auxiliary event that you wish to attend (no fee) on the Registration Form or the Eventbrite site. We are charging \$30 per person for the Reunion itself because the TDSB does not subsidize reunions (and we cannot run into debt for equipment, etc.) and because you will get a copy of the *Malvern at 110* book and a program. Everyone needs to register to get a name tag, the book, and a program at the Registration Desk in the cafeteria. Only those people who are companions to the elderly or disabled will be able to get in for free. Nametags will be worn inside the school. Inside is a day by day account of what to expect...

#### Friday 10 May 2013

All day on Friday, the school will be a beehive of activity, especially from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. Alumni who are volunteers will be working with the students to set up the entire school for the Reunion. If you want to volunteer, this is a good time to do it. Then you can spend all day Saturday with your friends. We hope all of this work will be completed by 6:00 p.m. on Friday.

There is a committee to set up all of the signage in the Parking Lot, halls, stairways, doors, and Decade Rooms. Archival displays will be set up in the Library and in the Archives Room. Sports displays will be set up in the large Gym. We hope to have displays of student work also. The Registration desks will be set up at one end of the Cafeteria. The Auditorium will need to be prepared for the Opening Ceremony. A tent is being erected on the south side of the school for the refreshments, i.e., pickup of pre-ordered lunches and sale of drinks on the day. An area for picking up "Malvern C.I. at 110" souvenirs will be set up.

#### Saturday 11 May 2013

Early on Saturday, the first volunteers to arrive will be those who are staffing the North Parking Lot. It will open at 8:30 a.m. for those who are on our list for Parking Passes. Please enter from Swanwick Avenue. If you are elderly (at Malvern before 1950) or disabled, please request a parking pass: call 416 393-8683 and leave your name, grad year, and phone number, and we will put you on our Parking Pass List, which will be used at the Gate. If you are able to walk, please park on one of the side streets. We are making arrangements with the Toronto Police not to ticket cars on the side streets that weekend.

Malvernites from the 1930s and 1940s should enter Malvern by the North Door as your registration will be in the hall by that door. The 1930s/40s Decade Room will be in the Library, and your lunch will be served there, too. The Auditorium and washrooms are on the same floor. The 50s Decade Rooms will also be on the Ground Floor. Please contact us soon if you have major accessibility issues.

For decades above 1940, Registration will take place in the Cafeteria unless you are unable to climb stairs. Then you will notify us ahead of time and you may register on the Ground Floor.

At Registration you will pick up your nametag, your *Malvern C.I. at 110* books, and your program. You will proceed to pick up your souvenirs at a designated spot.

If you plan to attend the Opening Ceremony, plan to arrive early to register by 9:00 a.m. so that you will all be in your seats for the Ceremony at 10:30 a.m. The Auditorium doors will open at 9:30 a.m. as the Band will be practising from 8:30 until 9:30 a.m. The Malvern Alumni Band will be playing orchestral music (old favourites), and there will be (short) speeches and tributes. An area will be reserved for the Senior Malvernites from the 30s and 40s Decades, and after that seating will be first come first served. If we have a very large registration, we will consider transmitting the event to an overflow area.

The Decade Rooms will be open at 9:00 a.m. We need volunteers who will oversee the rooms in one or two hour shifts for people to sign in their contact details (public information for

friends to look at in case they miss you). You can still talk to your friends if you do this. We are not planning to have any valuable memorabilia displayed, so feel free to photocopy any material that you would like to share and send it to us or bring it on the day. A series of posters will also be created. The 60s and 70s Decade Rooms will be on the second floor and the 80s, 90s and 2000s will be on the Third Floor. Volunteers are still needed to help make decade posters.

By mid-day, you will be feeling hungry. Bring your own lunch if you wish! The 30s and 40s Decades will pick up their pre-ordered lunches in or near the Library. We hope that the Malvern Home and School will be helping us with this part of the day. The other Decades will proceed to the Refreshment Tent by the South Field in front of the school any time after 11:30 a.m. Even if it rains, that is where to go. Drinks will be on sale there for everyone. Some of you may wish to walk to the Danforth or Kingston Road or elsewhere in the area for lunch.

The Decade Rooms will be open all afternoon until 4:00 p.m. In one of the gyms, the Band will be playing for Malvernites to dance to from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m.

Then at 5:00 p.m., noted local Beach Historian Gene Domagala will be meeting Malvernites at the flagpole and leading them on a fact-filled historic walk. Pub Nights are being planned for Saturday evening by Decade Co-ordinators and others. When we get more specific details, we will let you know. #### Sunday 12 May 2013

The school will be open at 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon for those who wish to see the Archival displays in the Library or who wish to check the sign-in Decade Books (in the Library) to look for friends they may have missed. Please note that all sign-in details in these books will be public information. At 10:00 a.m. there will be a Memorial Event in front of the Malvern Cenotaph for those who wish to pay their respects. We are hoping to have current Malvern students and teachers involved in this project. Those who wish may attend church services at their local church.

For the volunteers, the afternoon will be devoted to clean-up of the Decade Rooms, the gyms, and other areas as we wish to have it all completed by 4:00 p.m. Feel free to volunteer!

In the afternoon, there will also be two historic walking tours available, and Gene Domagala will meet people at the flag-pole at 1:00 and 4:00 p.m. Alternatively, people may wish to gather for an informal Boardwalk stroll. We need a volunteer to conduct this event, or you can choose one when you meet at the Woodbine Parking Lot at 1:45 p.m. Then at 3:00 p.m., Barbara Myrvold, librarian and author with Mary Campbell of *The Beach in Pictures, 1793-1932*, will be speaking to us on Beach History at the Beaches library at Queen and Lee. Then

you will be meeting friends or making your way home. We encourage you to come and make this event a great success. Onward Malvern!

#### Malvern grad won Croix de Guerre from grateful French Army in 1918

As we approach the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of the First World War, it's a time to revisit the stories of the boys of Malvern who fought for King and Country in 1914-1918. MRBS member David Fuller, who has been researching the stories of alumni who fought in both world wars, has recently taken on the job of managing editor of *The Maple Leaf*, the magazine of the Central Ontario Branch Western Front Association, and is contributing a cover story on grad Frank Szammers (Class of 1908) to the history group's winter 2013 issue. He was in the first class at Malvern, which entered in 1903.

Charles Franklin Szammers was the son of a railway man. His father John Charles Szammers was a foreman with the Grand Trunk Railway, and Frank went into civil engineering after graduating from the University of Toronto with an Applied Science degree in 1911. When war came, he joined the Canadian Expeditionary Force in July 1915 and became a member of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pioneer Battalion, a unit of the Canadian Engineers that recruited men from the skilled trades to build trenches, roads and transport lines. In 1917, after rising through the ranks to become a lieutenant, Szammers was picked to join a new unit, the 1<sup>st</sup> Tramways Company, that specialized in building narrow gauge rail lines used to move supplies to the front lines. During his years in France, Szammers was at all but one of every major battle in which Canadians fought.

In the August 1918, Szammers had made captain and was at Amiens where Allied troops had won the first in a string of victories that would become known as the "100 Days" leading to the end of the First World War. He was awarded the Croix de Guerre by the French Army for his work in opening up the tramway lines at Amiens and remained in France until January 1919.

Following the war, Szammers went to work for a construction company, married Mildred Florence Ross in 1929, and became a district supervisor for Ontario's Department of Northern Development in 1931, helping to build highways in the North Bay, Sudbury and Bancroft regions. He returned to Toronto and the head office of the Ontario Department of Highways in 1952 and retired in December 1957. His daughters Betsy and Ann both live in Etobicoke and shared memories of their father, who died in 1984, at age 96, for the magazine article.

The Szammers family lived at 30 Lyall Avenue for a time, and two of Frank's sisters also attended Malvern: Maud, who left in September 1909, and Gladys [McConnell], who left in January 1910 when the family moved to Callender Street in the west end of the city.
