

Malvern Archives

We are very proud of our vast archives located in Room 202A of the school. They contain over 6000 items that are in the process of being catalogued and digitized.

The archives contain 110 years of Commencement programs, almost all of the yearbooks, the Malvern Muse, since 1924, numerous vintage sports uniforms, a large collection of photographs dating back to 1903, a vertical file of news clippings about sports and other activities and about 30 boxes of documents and artifacts such as school pins, medals and trophies.

They also contain treasures of the school's history in art and document form. One example is a complete copy of the letters sent to his family by Captain William Commins M.C, who was killed in France during WW1 and whose name is on our Cenotaph.

Visitors may make an appointment to see the Archives by reaching out to us by email or social media.

Malvern Reunions

The school had reunions in 1953, 1963 and 1978. Much research was done for those reunions, which contributed to the wealth of material in the Malvern Archives.

Nothing has ever topped the large turnout in 2003 for the Malvern Centennial Reunion. It was estimated that 4000 Malvernites turned out on May 24, 2003 for a wonderful celebration.

Since then, various decade groups have held reunions- particularly the 40's, 50's and 60's, as well as the 70's classes. We have also heard of smaller reunions of 80's Malvernites and groups of Malvernites making music together.

In 2008 we held a reunion for Senior Malvernites, mainly from the 30's. We also have Facebook and Instagram Pages to keep up to date with your fellow classmates wherever life may take them.

MRBS Newsletter, Musings

We send out our Musings twice a year in the fall and in the spring. The newsletter contains news of Malvernites that members send to us and items of current interest. We also highlight student activities such as trips to France to visit war memorials. We publicize projects for which we are raising funds, such as Saving the Malvern Pool, Restoring the Malvern Cenotaph, and more recently restoring the WWII photo album of Malvernites who served.
