2021 AGM Minutes

President Report – Randy Deffett

I focused on strategic point to ensure our organization's future success and continuity. Our #1 priority is volunteers- expanding our numbers and having a continuous flow of new volunteers. We have been fortunate to have a long-term group of volunteers, so we have to watch for burn out. We welcome everybody! Come to us, do what you want, give us what time you are able and do it for as long as you are able. We need volunteers particularly for:

Why would you give us your time?

1. We have consulted with members to find out what they want.
2. Membership and social media subscriber numbers are growing.
3. We manage our finances prudently and have cut costs.

Postal Mail Vandra Masemann

Most members now donate online, using our Canada Helps link. Postal mail volume is negligible. From our Fall Musings postal mailing, 16 members have contacted us to switch to email contact. This will save on future postage costs.

Email Robert Watson

64 emails were received at our redandblack@malverncollegiate.com address in 2022. This is a significant increase; in 2020 we received 19 email messages. Our junk mail volume has been significantly cleaned up.

Database Dianne Renwick

A big thank you goes to Donna for her work. She worked through our entire database (3,000+ entries) to confirm correct entries and deceased members. Donna separated the database into: #1 Active members (email and postal) and #2 Inactive members ('no permission' list who have not given consent to contact and 648 deceased members). Of our social media subscribers (1,500+) 249 are registered on our membership database. Those who bought merchandise on our online Malvern Shop, their information is separate from member database. The database is a work in progress.

Question: With the cost of postage, why do we continue to mail to 471 postal only members? We are committed to do so because:

- MRBS core value is to 'Keep Malvernites in Touch': past, present and future.
- Historically, our most reliable financial donors have been our postal only members.
- Seniors particularly enjoy the feel of paper in their hands.
- We continually encourage those who use email to switch to email communication with us.
- We check closely to ensure addresses are valid- no wasted mail.

Social Media Sandra Burk

Our Facebook Group (1,077) and Facebook Page (379) subscribers may overlap. Instagram started in March, 2022 and is growing steadily (44 subscribers). We have had recent issues with intruders. We are mitigating the issue and will take additional action if needed. We have been following Malvernite obituary postings closely. Social media subscriber numbers are growing steadily each month. We are creating new website content to enhance the website experience.

Treasurer Report Robert Watson

Robert presented summary of: Malvern Wear, Commencement brochure, MRBS Award and Onward Malvern Foundation monies received. As of our MRBS financial year-end, June 2022. book balance= \$2,110.06. With the Fall Musings October publication and an improved online donation connection, we have received \$772 in donations to the MRBS in just over a month.

Motion to accept the Treasurer Report: Robert Watson/Randy Deffett. Carried.

Question: What is the long-term viability of our Malvern Wear Shop? We had one-time start-up (technical) costs that are now past. It is expected that future net profit will be higher and we have a good, long term business with our clothing supplier, Mountain View Impressions (an MCI graduate). The Malvern Shop was launched to create excitement with our membership, to show that the MRBS is active and to make some profit. Mission accomplished.

Service Personnel Historian Report David Fuller

Veterans and Cenotaph Restoration Report was presented. A second database of 1,000+ service personnel was only possible from Donna Halliday's work. Ongoing work is being done to locate living relatives of MCI veterans. A critical part of the cenotaph restoration is finding and implementing security measures, in consultation with the TDSB.

Archives Committee Report Vandra Masemann

We are impressed with how much we were able to carry on during the pandemic 2+ year school closure. Sadly, Irene Hubel passed away during the summer. We are looking for her four binders of archival material. If we cannot locate, we can replicate the material. More acid-free storage boxes were purchased, so now all of the archive records are now properly stored. We now have access to the Archives Room so we can sell remaining Centennial Reunion books at \$10.00. We welcome new Committee volunteers:

Garden Committee Report Volker Masemann and Vandra Masemann

MCI reconstruction, covering the entire front of the school, is about to begin. The TDSB will install new landscaping and 'soften' the steep slope that runs down to the cafeteria. All of the gardens will be removed and we do not know what any future gardens may look like.

Technical Support Report David Fuller

Our much-improved online donation icon is live and will keep donors on our website. Recent problems with our internet site provider, Blue Host, seem to have subsided. The urgent need to switch ISP provider is passed for now. Mail Chimp filters are aggressive in filtering out Spam email addresses. A recommendation is for future database maintenance measures, as outlined in submitted report. Big thank you to Paul Warner for creating our website In Memoriam Page! From its launch in September 2022, it quickly became our most popular website page.

Question: Could Malvern Wear Shop sales create tax considerations that may affect our non-profit status? Our revenues would have to exceed \$30,000 annually to be a concern.

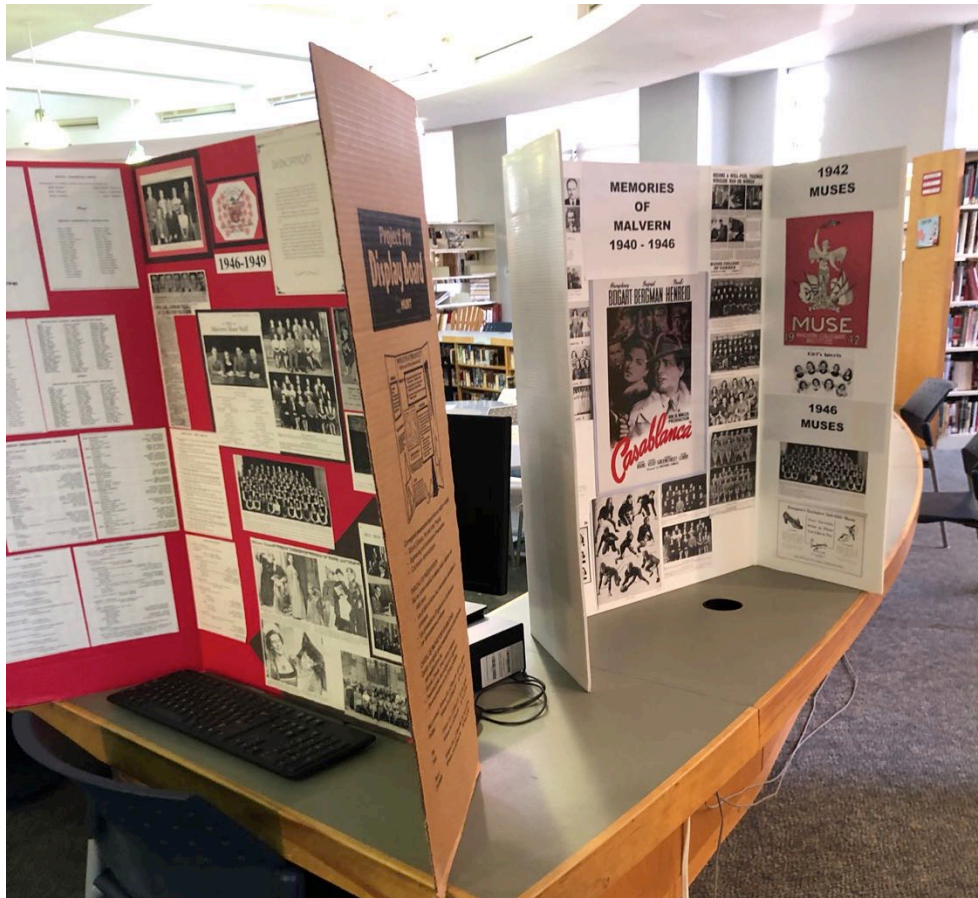
Other Business

Archives Committee Report– Donna Halliday and Vandra Masemann

We continued to work on the Malvern Archives from September 2022 to June 2023. As of September 2022, we had access to the Malvern CI school building. We were very sad to hear in late summer of 2022 that our member, Irene Hubel, had died earlier that summer. Unfortunately, we have not been able to trace the Malvern Archives material that she had been keeping over the pandemic period, although we have contacted family members. This included numerous news clippings, lists of athletic championships and scholarships, and obituaries. We are able to reproduce this material with some effort.

We have purchased much needed archival supplies, and now almost all of our collection is housed in suitable acid-free boxes, folders and covers. Thanks very much to those who donated specifically to the Malvern Archives. We are very proud of the progress we have made in the past 17 years.

Souvenirs

We still have some *Malvern Centennial* and *Malvern at 110* books in stock. They are for sale at \$10 per copy. Some early Malvern Muses and vinyl records of the Malvern Band are also available on inquiry, as are a few souvenir items from earlier Reunions. We also have MCI120 souvenir T shirts, coffee mugs, and tote bags available via the Malvern Shop on our website, www.malverncollegiate.com.

Committee Members

Vandra Masemann chaired this committee in 2022-2023 and performed all of the Archives Committee liaison functions with the Principal, Sandy Kaskens. She relayed inquiries from Malvernites to committee members for research on school history, relatives and other Malvernites. She dealt with inquiries from Facebook online and from the redandblack webmail, mainly about alumni asking for copies of old Muses or donating various objects to the Archives. There are also continuing inquiries about finding names or photos of relatives in our records. During the pandemic, Sandy Kaskens made great progress in making the collection more accessible to students and staff. She had photo collages made of the early years of the school, and graduation photos of as many years of Malvern grads as possible. These are all mounted on the walls of the first-floor halls at Malvern. The MRBS donated to the school to help with these expenses.

Volker Masemann helps with routine tasks of the committee. His main focus was the gardens in front of the school, but as the new landscaping has obliterated the gardens, his main work will be as a member of the Archives Committee.

Lois Maxwell has cut, labelled and filed paper items, and is still working on bringing the files up to date and duplicating them. Lois, Ila Vaculik, and Lyn Bradshaw were also seconded to the MRBS Reunion Committee to restore and create display boards for the MCI 120 Reunion in May 2023. They used material from the Malvern Archives.

Bob Watson, who has been busy as Treasurer on other matters for MRBS, is available to assist the Archives Group when needed. He also relays messages from Malvernites with archival questions in the redandblack email webmail, and relays any relevant information for the MRBS database to Dianne Renwick and Ingrid Bubersky, and for the In-Memoriam page to Paul Warner.

Erik Malmsten is a top contributor on Facebook to the Malvern Red and Black Society's group. He scanned photos and cartoons from the Muse, lists of award winners from archive binders, and newspaper articles on commencement, football, hockey and concert bands. He also made a list of Malvernites who become medical doctors. He wrote biographies of athletes such as "Yip" Foster and "Ab" Box for the The Beach and East Toronto Historical Society (tbeths) page and an article on Olympians from the Beach.

David Fuller has done extensive research on Malvernites, staff and students in the Armed Forces and written articles on his findings. He also was the keynote speaker at the 100th anniversary of the Malvern Cenotaph in May 2022. He has given yearly talks to the Beach and East Toronto Historical Society about aspects of local history.

Ila Vaculik and **Lyn Bradshaw** are our newest members, who help to process and maintain the collection. They assisted Lois Maxwell in preparing and restoring display boards for the Malvern 120 Reunion in May 2023.

Donna Halliday has compiled the archival database and accessioned all items on it. There are still a few items in the archive room in need of accessioning. The large grey box #12 and items on display in the cabinets need to be added to the database. She has created a database for staff, sports, Muses, Malvernites in the Armed Forces, etc. She also worked on updating the MRBS Members' database. We continue to get donations of team wear, books, pins, certificates, etc. from former Malvernites or items sent by relatives from their estates.

The main archival database has been completed with over 6000 entries, which have been transferred to a flash drive. All items on this database have been accessioned so they will be easier to find and easier to return to their proper location. We have presented our database to Greg McKinnon, the TDSB archivist, so it will be included in the TDSB Museum Archival database. Several updates of 100 items each have been emailed to Jason Cheung, one of the Board archivists for inclusion with the main database.

Jobs to be done:

- ☐ running off duplicate copies of all news and paper items
- ☐ updating all lists, including staff, sports, drama, etc.
- ☐ adding more information to the archive database
- ☐ labelling all photos
- ☐ scanning more of the Muses
- ☐ creating a database of all Malvernites from 1903 to the present
- ☐ creating a database of all Illustrious Malvernites

Organizing the archives is an ongoing job, as new items are always being added to the Malvern collection. We would never have gotten all this work done if it were not for all the volunteers who have given us so many hours over the years. More volunteers are always welcome. Thank you all.

MCI120 120th ANNIVERSARY REUNION REPORT

Your MRBS and the MCI administration hosted a hugely successful Reunion on Saturday May 13, 2023. Attendance was amazing. 800+ people attended the school Open House and 720+ alumni attended the 4 MRBS pub events during the evening. The pubs were popular across all decades:

- 1940s, 50s & 60s= 141 attendees
- 1970s (2 venues) = 301 attendees
- 1980s to Present= 278 attendees

At Malvern attendees enjoyed the grad photograph hall displays and decade rooms, then could go to the auditorium for the Teacher Recognition ceremony and music performances by the alumni/student band (about 40 alumni musicians) and a folk music quartet of 1960s alumni.

70+ student volunteers helped us to prepare and to welcome attendees. Your MRBS volunteers planned for months and additional alumni helped on the big day (Open House and pubs)! MCI staff were enthusiastic, in particular, Nickie Lewis and Michael Falla. To all the volunteers who helped (below), thank you! If I missed you, sorry. I am grateful for contributions, great or small.
