MALVERN CENOTAPH APPEAL LAUNCHED

On May 24, 2022, the Malvern community gathered to mark the 100th anniversary of the dedication of the cenotaph. An outdoor ceremony beginning at 10am featured local dignitaries, guest speakers and students reading out the names of the men whose names adorn the base of the statue, along with performances by the Malvern band and choir. A live stream of the event was also broadcast to students in their classrooms.

The event also served to announce the beginning of a new campaign to repair the monument and upgrade security measures to ward off future vandals. This project will not be a full restoration, which was done in 2011, but will include sculpting a new sword and replacing some of the hand-crafted lead lettering that was damaged when pranksters climbed on it. We had hoped to finish this project in time for 2022, but the pandemic delayed our plans. Please be generous to help us raise \$10,000 for this project. About your Tax Receipts... The Onward Malvern Foundation and CanadaHelps

MRBS - Organizational Progress in 2022 The Tribe Has Spoken

In April 2022, the MRBS sent out a survey to all Malvernites on our email list, and in July we followed it up with a survey to those who were hard to reach or that we had not heard from in a while. We received an excellent response to both surveys from the Malvern community. We received alumni responses from the 1940s to the 2010s. 95% of respondents were aware of the MRBS, and 63% were members. Respondents wanted Alumni News (87%) and Social Events (67%). Respondents wanted to hear from the MRBS on a quarterly basis (48%) with email being the favoured communication (86%). This information will help the MRBS formulate initiatives for the upcoming year. Updating our Database during the Pandemic

During the past two years, I have cross checked the MRBS master database (db). I've removed all the 'no-permission' members, the members who have passed away, the bounce backs, etc. The final results are an Active Master of 1436 members, (emails 969, snail 464) and no permissions of 1008. The deceased db is 648 members, about 200 of them from the original master db. Of the 1000 FB members, 249 of them are also on the master db. The members' db has been sent to the database manager Dianne Renwick and the relevant Executive members. Its privacy is strictly guarded.

Congratulations to Kristine Drakich, (Malvern Class of 83) for being voted into the Volleyball Canada Hall of Fame in June 2022!

Here is the write-up from the University of Toronto: Kristine Drakich - Women's Volleyball Coach - University of Toronto Athletics (varsityblues.ca):

"Varsity Blues alumna and Toronto native, Kristine Drakich has been the head coach of the women's volleyball program since 1989-90. Under her direction, the Blues have qualified for 30 OUA [Ontario University Athletics] Final Four appearances in 31 years, including 22 consecutive appearances from 1990-2010, winning the OUA championship 11 times. She led the Blues to a 25-0 perfect season in 2015-16, claiming their second straight OUA banner, and first-ever national championship in program history. Drakich earned U SPORTS national coach of the year honours in 2014-15.

A former captain and all-Canadian with the Varsity Blues, Kristine was a member of Canada's national volleyball and beach volleyball teams and was a 2001 inductee into the University of Toronto's Sports Hall of Fame and in the Ontario Volleyball Association Hall of Fame in 2018. She has volunteered at almost every level of the sport, internationally and nationally with the Fédération Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB), International University Sports Federation (FISU), Canadian University Sport (USports), Volleyball Canada, Ontario Volleyball Association and she was the Sport Organizing Chair for volleyball at the TO2015 Pan American Games."

Memories of Mr. Douglas

When I was getting ready to enter Grade 10 at Malvern in 1956, I received what we all did then, a list of all your teachers for the coming year. When I saw the Vice-Principal's name (Mr. Douglas), for Math, I shivered as he had a reputation of being tough. When I got to my first class with him, I was surprised to find only about 20 students in the room, my smallest class ever at MCI. He turned out to be one of the best teachers I ever had. Subsequently, when I was changing classes and he was doing hall duty, he often would ball out young students for making too much noise as I remembered from when I was young. One day when he had done this to a group ahead of me, when I quietly went past him, he looked at me and winked. Mr. Douglas was tough, but he also had a sense of humour.



Remembering my Brother, David Barr, Malvern Cl Class of 1993*
On the Occasion of Renaming Hope House in his Honour in Guelph, April 30, 2022

David was a special young man as evidenced by the many cards and letter my parents received as well as the overwhelming attendance at his funeral. Words such as loved, humble, strong, accepting and missed come to mind when I think of how David was remembered by his friends. He left an impression on all he met, not so much by his words but by his actions. He truly led by example and treated everyone with respect.



I have been involved at Hope House since its inception in 2012. I have found using my talents to help the marginalized in my community very fulfilling. Hope House treats our community members with dignity and respect as it meets their needs in practical and innovative ways. It has grown from providing food to the marginalized in Guelph to offering

a wide variety of services including programs such as Ease Back to Work, access to clothing at no cost, a produce garden for food, counselling services, and the list goes on.

I had the opportunity to name the building which Hope House and several other charities operate out of when Hope House purchased the building. The naming ceremony allowed me to say goodbye to David and give him the eulogy that I was not up to giving at his funeral. In many ways, it was a gift to my parents who were fearful that David would be forgotten. A number of David's schoolmates made the trip to Guelph from all over the province, a courtesy which in my mind is a tribute to his impact even after all these years.

It was and still is a loss that I will never get over, but giving back in a tangible way has helped me cope with the loss of my brother.
