President's Report - Sandra Burk

Sandra presented her report, answered questions and comments. We coped very well despite the pandemic restrictions and undertook lots of activity. We welcome donations and volunteers. We extend our appreciation to MCI Principal, Sandy Kaskens and Nickie Lewis, office administrator.

Vice-President's Report- Randy Deffett

Randy appreciated all editorial input in the revision of governing documents. Thanked all MRBS volunteers for their long-term commitment to MRBS and thanked Paul Warner and David Fuller for their work to update website.

Communications Reports- various

Postal Mail Vandra Masemann

We have had a dramatic drop in postal mail since our early years. Mailed in cheques reduced since so many donors now use CanadaHelps. Malvern Wear site has run with no physical paper work. This is all good since it has taken time to regain access to MCI, due to the pandemic.

Email Robert Watson

There has been little email activity; received 19 emails from members and approximately 200 junk emails (some were from members). Sandra Burk noted it appears that, increasingly, people prefer to connect with us via Face Book.

Database Dianne Renwick & Donna Halliday

Dianne gave a big thank you to Donna for her database work. In 2021 a lot of database (dbase) updates were completed. These included:

- Email members= 1,000+ members.
- Postal mail (only) dbase= 471 members (including USA & international members)
- Dbase of deceased members is being updated.
- Review of our 2,600+ Master dbase; about 50% have not given express consent.

Dbase work still to be completed:

- Many new email members need to be added to our Master dbase.
- Review of postal mail dbase.
- Review of obituaries collected since 2013 to match with MRBS dbase.

Requested members to check their contact information is current and to update. Encourage other members you know to do the same.

Treasurer's Report Robert Watson

Robert presented report covering our fiscal year, July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021; responded to questions. Will follow-up on \$100 MRBS Award cheque issued June 24, 2021 but not cashed as of September.

Service Personnel Historian's Report David Fuller

Cenotaph Project - Will follow up with TDSB Facilities Manager. Manager was excited by security roller system from Canadian supplier. We should add interpretive signage for Cenotaph. Cenotaph refreshment is eligible for funding from Federal Government Veterans Affairs. David's projected budget= \$10,000 approximately (including sword replacement, lettering, repairs, security, signage). Budget much lower than earlier restoration.

Big Book (of WWII Veterans)- Needs to be preserved and photos scanned. Sandra Burk noted MRBS was invited by TDSB to reapply for funding. David agreed, TDSB said they are favourable to Big Book restoration.

We have some 6,000 articles in Archives and all items in the Archives Room are labelled to enable tracking if signed out. Archives is being digitized (inventory of items) and we are working to scan all issues of the Muse. Erik Malmsten and Donna Halliday are updating the MRBS Wikipedia entry.

We have enjoyed positive comments from neighbourhood residents and enthusiastic support of MCI caretaking and administrative staff, Christopher Jobe and Nickie Lewis. Sandra Burk noted City of Toronto provides Pollinator Garden funding for public projects. We may qualify, if we apply.

With revised Charter, we are electing all Board of Director positions this year. Terms of office for this election will set future staggered election times, to help with continuity of leadership. During the past two years, I have cross checked the MRBS master database (db). I have removed all the 'no-permission' members, the members who have passed away, the bounce backs, etc. The final results are an Active Master of 1,436 members, (emails 969, snail 464) and no permissions of 1,008. The deceased db is 648 members, about 200 of them from the original master db. Of the 1,000 Facebook members, 249 of them are also on the master db. The members' db has been sent to the database manager Dianne Renwick and the relevant Executive members. Its privacy is strictly guarded.

Service Personnel Historian's Report

Veterans and Cenotaph Restoration


Research into the 1,123 Malvern alumni who served in the First or Second World War has continued but at a slower pace than in previous years. We continue to be contacted by family members inquiring about some of the names through Ancestry.ca, but few of these know much about the Malvern veterans themselves. However, this source has sometimes resulted in amazing connections that yielded photos and information that couldn't have been had otherwise.

The Cenotaph repair plan includes a suggestion of interpretive signage that will require some of the information in my veterans' database, which was built on the wonderful original data built by Donna Halliday from the "Those Who Served" Remembrance Day programs. We are still considering turning this data into an online, searchable resource when other priorities have been addressed (e.g. the repair campaign itself).

The 100th anniversary of the Cenotaph went very well and I spoke on a live stream to attendees and students in their classrooms, referring to the research about the 25 men named on it.

In retirement, I plan to resume researching and writing articles about Malvern veterans, and, of course, I am always available to speak to students and community groups such as the Beach East Toronto Historical Society.

Committee Reports

(a) Archives Committee Report

Archives Committee

We continued to work on the Malvern Archives throughout 2021. However, because of the covid-19 pandemic, we did not have access to the Malvern CI school building at all. During this period, we continued to work online at home on several projects. Donna also delivered paper clippings and archival materials to Irene

We have purchased much needed archival supplies, and now almost all of our collection is housed in suitable acid-free boxes, folders and covers. Thanks very much to those who donated specifically to the Malvern Archives. We are very proud of the progress we have made in the past seventeen years.

Souvenirs

We still have some *Malvern Centennial* and *Malvern at 110* books in stock. They are for sale at \$10 per copy when we are able to get them from the school. We will offer them for sale on the MRBS Shop when we are able to procure them. In the Fall of 2021, we successfully offered Malvern Hoodies with crest and Malvern Caps with logo on them. The report on the revenues will be found in the Treasurer's Report.

Committee Members

Vandra Masemann chaired this committee in 2021 and performed all of the liaison functions with the new Principal, Sandy Kaskens. She relayed inquiries from Malvernites to committee members for research on school history, relatives and other Malvernites. She dealt with inquiries from Facebook online, mainly about alumni asking for copies of old Muses or donating various objects to the Archives. She is working on the future plans for making the collection more accessible to students and staff.

Volker Masemann helps with routine tasks of the committee. His main focus is the gardens in front of the school. He is also helped by Joyce Heighway.

Irene Hubel, who has recently passed away, was still collecting obits and news articles about Malvernites and Malvern, and had compiled two binders of obits. She has also updated all the lists of Malvern award and scholarship winners, collected news and cut, labelled and filed it.

Lois Maxwell has cut, labelled and filed paper items, and is still working on bringing the files up to date and duplicating them. She is also helping to update the Members' database.

Bob Watson, who has been busy on other matters for MRBS, is available to assist the Archives Group when needed.

Joyce Heighway has worked in the archives wherever the need.

Erik Malmsten has been working with Donna Halliday on updating the Wikipedia entry for Malvern CI. He previously compiled a list of Malvernites who became doctors, and those who were hockey players. He researched our archival collection of photos about music at Malvern and posted them and some old views of the school on Facebook in September 2020. He also researches for other local historical groups, such as the Beach and East Toronto Historical Society, and notes when those on various databases (e.g. Illustrious Beachers and Olympic athletes) are Malvernites. A few years ago he started an index page of the Malvern people in the folders which needs to be finished. Added to that, he had made a spreadsheet with a more detailed list with links to Wikipedia pages. He is also interested in the project of making a list of commencement speakers, if they're always given in the programme.

David Fuller has done extensive research on Malvernites, staff and students in the Armed Forces and written articles on his findings. He has usually participated at Remembrance Day events when possible.

Ila Vaculik is our newest member, and also helps to process and maintain the collection.

All of these tasks are ongoing and may change as the need arises.

Donna Halliday is compiling the archival database and has accessioned all items on it. New items are frequently being donated, so this task is ongoing. The large grey box #12 and items on display in the cabinets need to be added to the database. She has created a database for staff, sports, Muses, Malvernites in the Armed Forces, etc. During the pandemic, Donna had dropped off newspapers and obituaries to Irene's house and picked up items Irene has completed and added them to the database. Sadly, Irene passed away in the summer of 2022, and we are in the process of retrieving the archival material on which she was working. Condolences to her husband, family and friends. After two years of working on updating the MRBS Members' database, she has finally completed it and handed it over to the db manager. We continue to get donations of team wear, books, pins, certificates, etc. from former Malvernites or their estates, Malvern staff or their estates, etc.

The main archival database has over 6000 entries to date, which have been transferred to a flash drive. All items on this database have been accessioned so they will be easier to find and easier to return to their proper location. We have presented our database to Greg McKinnon, the TDSB archivist, so it will be included in the TDSB Museum Archival database. Two updates of 100 items each have been

emailed to Jason Cheung, one of the Board archivists for inclusion with the main database.

We have helped the principal Sandy Kaskens locate photos of former principals for display, as well as photos she is using to create collages of graduates from the early years.

Jobs to be done

- running off duplicate copies of all news and paper items
- > updating all lists, including staff, sports, drama, etc.
- > adding more info to the archive database
- ➤ labelling all photos
- scanning more of the Muses
- > creating a database of all Malvernites from 1903 to the present
- > creating a database of all Illustrious Malvernites

Organizing the archives is an ongoing job, as new items are always being added to the Malvern collection. We would never have gotten all this work done if not for all the volunteers who have given us so many hours over the years. More volunteers are always welcome. Thank you all.

(b) Technical Support

After the successful launch of the shop in late 2020 for the Malvernware campaign, we continue to receive orders for leftover stock (hats) and backorders for hoodies and shirts, and the WooCommerce app has been updated and improved. A green donation button has been added to the front page, along with an image to promote the shop. The donation page now has a Canada Helps form embedded into it, so users do not need to go to another website.

We discussed moving to a new ISP (internet service provider) due to problems with Blue Host. These issues have calmed down for the moment, but we should consider moving again, if outages reoccur.

Site redesign will get started again now that the Technical chair is retired (moi).

We have uploaded the membership/subscriber list to Mail Chimp to merge it with the Shop customer data (they are not all subscribers). There was an issue with Mail Chimp's strict filtering of addresses that cut the database in half. Some of this was due to outdated email addresses, but some was caused by the strict policies aimed at maintaining confidence in the platform to thwart spammers. We will continue to look for a solution that will maximize our access to Malvernites whose information we have been given as we also try to confirm interest from people who have not given us consent, yet. As a backup, Tim Daciuk has used his access to a different email platform to reach the rest of the available addresses, along with a new request to provide consent that will allow us to add them to the Mail Chimp db. We still need to discuss database maintenance. This should be moved online with a CRM (customer relationship management) tool so manual updating of spreadsheets is no longer required. I will scout out some possibilities for a recommendation. MailChimp has some capabilities but not for all the data we want to record on our members (grad year, maiden names, notes, etc.) Putting the database in the cloud will make it easier to update for use.

One note on website traffic: we saw a big jump in visits to the website after the In-Memoriam section was added by Paul Warner. It instantly became the most-visited part of the site, a trend which I suspect will continue. It is a popular thing with our audience looking to learn about their former classmates.
